- 1. Are you aware that at one time we had dogs in downstairs Pollard Hall? In 1975 the 4 H Nifty Heelers started dog training for seeing eye dogs. Two of our members ran the program. Marge and Harold Rife.
- 2. What special type of wedding did we have in 1951? The children of the Sunday School put on a Tom Thumb wedding.
- 3. Did we ever have a shipwreck in Pollard Hall? Yes, In 1981 the Sr. Highs sponsored a dinner with that theme and asked guests to dress accordingly.
- 4. In which Stirling store did our church hold services for a year? Dorsi's
- 5. Did you know the women of the church wrote a song at retreat? In 1994
- 6. How many retreats did the women have at Johnsonburg? *The Ladies attended yearly retreats between 1982-1995.*
- 7. Who turned over the 1st, shovel of ground to build the addition to Pollard Hall? *Albert Richter, longest time member. He was honored in 1977. He served as elder for 45 yrs and half time as treasurer.*
- 8. Who was our first woman elder? Carolyn Karthaeuser in 1958.
- 9. Who was the longest serving Pastor of First Presbyterian Church of Stirling? *Rev. Dr. Thomas T. Peters*
- 10. Did we ever celebrate with a Seder supper on Maundy Thursday? Yes, the first one was in 1976.
- 11. Who made our kneeling bench and has maintained our church sign over the years? *Dale Monetti*
- Did you know that through our Deacon's efforts, the Township Sr. Citizens group got its start? Yes, In 1972.
- 13. Also did you know a committee of our church members started the project for "Fair Housing for Senior Citizens" . *It is now Lounsberry Meadows.*
- 14. What are church cherubs? A choir of children, we had 10-12 at one time, red bows and all. The choir sang in the 60's and 70's.
- 15. Did we ever have a couples' club? Yes, we met once a month, had dinner and had a social time. This was during the 50s-60s.
- 16. The Men's Group used to do annual Spaghetti Dinners in Pollard Hall. In 1999, who was the manager of the men for this occasion? John Darby – check the March 1999 archives for some pictures.
- 17. When the Long Hill Senior Center was constructed, there were many volunteers as they positioned the A-frames. Which minister was part of the volunteers? *Rev. Tom Peters (when)*
- 18. Did you know beginning in 2008, the nursery school that runs in the lower level of the church complex was renamed to be The Long Hill Montessori School. What was the original name of the school? Young World Montessori School

- 19. Who was the church secretary before Paulette Irlander? B.J. Cardinali
- 20. Who was the church treasurer after Carolyn Karthauser? This gentleman held this position for nine years! *Warren Hoffman* (1995 - 2004)
- 21. What annual event was held on the church grounds during mid-December that usually involved hot cider and hot cocoa afterwards? *Christmas Caroling on the front lawn of the church. (pics when)*
- 22. Who is currently (2023) the longest attending member at this time? Joyce Koenig – check out our member enrollment book. She joined FPCS on October 5, 1956.
- 23. Did we ever work with the Morristown Habitat for Humanity to build a house? What year 2000, 2002, 2004? Yes, in March 2000, a group of members participated in building a house in Chester, NJ.
- 24. Who were the two members of the church who took a trans-American bike trip across the country in 1998? They also biked from Millington to Cape May and back in the summer of 1983. Check the archives for the answer. *Lynn and Bill Combs*
- 25. Who wrote "Stirling on the Hill" for our church and when is it usually played? Hint: Check the archives for 1998. *Richard Streeton wrote the music for us and played it for us on Heritage Sunday, November 30, 1998.*
- 26. Did we ever have a youth car wash in the church parking lot? When was the last one held? Yes, 2001 – check the pictures.
- Did the youth of our church ever go rafting on the Delaware River in the Poconos? If so, who went? Hint: check the archives for 2001.

- 30. Which church members created the beautiful banners that hang in the sanctuary of our church? Hint: check the 2001 archive book. *Marge Krummel primarily sewed the banners. Later, Ellen Eastty assisted Marge.*
- 31. Did you know that a member of our church had a renowned quilt collection on display at the church on March 20, 1999? Who was this member?

- 32. What special dedication was held on June 6, 1999, during a worship service at church? *Dedication of our handbells in memory of June Travnicek, Barbara Cardinali's mom.*
- 33. Did you know that our Travnicek Memorial Bell Ringers had several concerts together with another church? Name the other church from the 2012 archive book. Wilson Memorial – Rev. Barbara Peters' church
- 34. At the turn of the century, in the year 2000, what was another special dedication that was held at our church? Dedication of our church's Memorial Garden
- 35. How did members of the church come dressed to the service on June 14, 1998? What was the special occasion? In celebration of our 125th anniversary of the church, folks came dressed in outfits typical of the 1800's time period.

- 38. Did you know that one Archive Sunday was celebrated along with Mother's Day? The Men's group had a special coffee hour for the moms and the Worship Committee created the display of the Archives for all to view. Which year was this done 2002, 2003, or 2004? The event happened on Mother's Day, May 11, 2003.
- 39. Did you know in the year 2003, a long-time member of our church was honored for his service in the Korean War? Who was this member? George Lare, husband of Bert Lare of Warren.
- 40. Who were the two church members who grew up in Chatham, were classmates in kindergarten, and later married?

- 49. Rev. Peters was known for the work he did to encourage local churches, synagogues, and mosques to get together for interfaith services. Did you know he participated in a Community of Faith service at St. Vincent de Paul church for Morris, Union, and Somerset counties in October 2006? - 55. Which church member won a prize worth \$3500 from the Millington Savings Bank during their 100th anniversary celebration as described in the Echoes Sentinel article of July 28th, 2011? According to the article, Joyce Koenig used the money to travel to Paris, France – her dream come true trip!
- 56. Did you know that several members of our church got together on many occasions to attend a baseball game at the local Patriots stadium in Bridgewater, NJ? - 58. Did you know that our church along with Meyersville Presbyterian and Trinity United held many joint soup suppers? What was the theme from the February 2012 series. Yes, the theme was "Search for Answers to Big Questions."
- 59. What year is on the cornerstone of the church? 1872
- 60. Did you know the church building has been declared a historic site? Check the plaque hanging on the outside the building by the front doors to the sanctuary.
 - Yes there is a nice plaque celebrating the building as a historical site.
- 61. How is the front of the church different from the original structure? Can you find a picture showing the difference? The front of the church changed when the roof over the entrance with its prominent gingerbread trim was removed.
- 62. What shape does the interior of the sanctuary make? Hint: Stand by the vestibule and look inside. Remember to include the two wings right and left of the chancel. A Cross!
- 63. Did you know the original church sanctuary had no center aisle as it does today? Why? A former member of the church was getting married and wanted a center aisle, so they paid to have the pews cut in half and pushed to either side.

64. How many ministers do you remember serving at First Presbyterian Church of Stirling, including Rev. Stefanie Muntzel, our current pastor. Name them. (Hint: check out the third edition of "A History of The First Presbyterian Church Stirling, New Jersey.")

- 65. Who wrote the first edition of our pamphlet, "A History of The First Presbyterian Church Stirling, New Jersey?" The second edition? The third edition? *First edition: Fletcher Ingalls (1964) Second edition: Irma and Robert Mikulyak (1973) and Third edition: Worship Committee (1999)*
- 66. Who was the first pastor of our church, First Presbyterian Church of Stirling? *Rev. Henry M. Grant*
- 67. Did you know that at one time there were two services here at Stirling—one at 9:30 am and the other at 11:00 am and two Sunday School sessions as well? When did this occur? 1960 marked the beginning of holding two complete services, including Sunday School sessions for each.
- 68. What was the reason behind the 1963 addition in the rear of the sanctuary at a cost of \$60,000? The Sunday School had grown so much, they needed to add on new classroom space.
- 69. The Pollard Hall addition (first floor and basement) was added in 1947-48. Who provided the majority of the funds and in whose memory was it dedicated? George Pollard in memory of his sister, Grace Pollard, who was an active worker in the Stirling Church for many years.
- 70. What was the Y.M.C.A. building that sat on the part of the parking lot nearest to the church. The Y.M.C.A. building was originally the coach barn, or carriage house, for the old hotel that used to stand about where the Karthaeusers' house is now (behind the manse).
