**Girl Scout Project**

Long Hill Township Girl Scout Troops 2211 and 2169 are collecting items for a Haitian orphanage. The girls' section of the orphanage was completely destroyed in the January earthquake. Brooke Kupferman has set up a box in Pollard Hall to collect the following items: clothing and shoes, in good condition, children to adult sizes (skirts are especially needed); new undergarments; towels; soap; shampoo; toothpaste and toothbrushes; and, socks. The items will be collected through May 9<sup>th</sup>, and the troops will then hold a bake sale to raise money to ship them to Haiti.

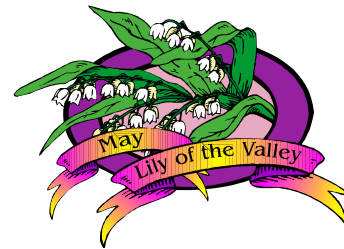
