LGBT* Questions and the Pursuit of Understanding

*LGBT is short for "Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgendered"

We hear so much in the news today about LGBT issues. Recent headlines include topics such as:

- The end of "Don't Ask, Don't Tell"
- The suicide of Rutgers student, Tyler Clemente, and the trial of his roommate
- Civil Unions and Same-Sex Marriages
- Gender questions about a "Dancing With The Stars" contestant
- New ordination standards in the PCUSA

Many people have strong feelings about these topics and frame arguments as moral or religious issues.

How do we respond? What are our church's teachings about topics of gender and sexuality? We've heard parts of the Bible that pertain to traditional marriage. What else is there?

We are working on a series of sessions to explore some of these questions. Topics will include:

- What does the Bible say about marriage and sexuality?
- How do we respond to people who identify as LGBT, both inside and outside the church?

We invite you to join in the conversations as we explore these questions.

Rev. Peters will also begin the study of Robert Morris' book, *Wrestling With Grace*.

World Communion Sunday

On Sunday, **October 2nd**, we will celebrate the Sacrament of Communion with Christians around the world. We hope you will join us for this special service, and <u>we invite you to wear</u> some traditional garb representing your ethnic background.

World Communion Sunday is a celebration observed by several Christian denominations, taking place on the first Sunday of every October, that promotes Christian unity and ecumenical cooperation. The tradition originated in the Shadyside Presbyterian Church in 1933, was adopted throughout the US Presbyterian Church in 1936, and subsequently spread to other denominations. In 1940, the Federal Council of Churches (now the National Council of Churches), led by Jesse Moren Bader, endorsed World Communion Sunday and began to promote it to Christian churches worldwide.
