## Pastor's Letter

It is so hard when there is something you really want to start, but for good reasons the time is not right. You worry about being able to keep the energy up to do it until the time is right. Jesus even experienced this as he slowly educated his disciples about faithful living. When Jesus was at the wedding in Cana and they ran out of wine, his mother, Mary, reported this to him. He said, *“My time has not come yet.”* Even Jesus understood that there was a time for all things - just like the writer of Ecclesiastes wrote in his famous verses, *“For every thing there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven...”*



The leaders of our New Beginnings program have all agreed that we should start the program the second week of September so that we are not doing it over the summer when many people are away. The leaders felt that they needed some time to assimilate the information they received at the two-day cluster event, and, by then we would be into the summer months. However, that does not mean that we cannot all be doing something during this time as we prepare for the program. As you attend various events in and around town during the summer months, or as you talk with your neighbors, ask people what they think is needed in our community. What is missing in this area? Write down their responses/suggestions somewhere so that you don't forget them. Don't judge any ideas as being too small or too big. You might also spend some time in reflection about what you are passionate about and what gifts you have. Your responses to these questions will eventually become grist for the discussions in your small groups. This does not mean that our church's eventual new beginning will reflect your passion, etc., but it becomes an important part of the dialogue.

Currently, we are in a process of doing *“Minute for Beginnings”* presentations during our worship service. On June 17<sup>th</sup>, the leaders will begin signing people up to participate in the small groups/house meetings that will start in September. It is important that we get as many people as we can to participate in this program. Your voice is important to the dialogue; and, even if some of your thoughts do not make it into the final proposal, you will gain an understanding of the process and how/why we ended up where we did. When you are asked to be part of one of these groups, please say yes.

We continue to collect non-perishable food in the baskets located in the entry-ways to the church during the rest of the month.

**Guest Preacher**

On Sunday, May 6<sup>th</sup>, Elder Francis Maina of Nairobi, Kenya was our guest preacher. Elder Maina is a member of the Kayole Parish, a church in the Nairobi East Presbytery and part of the Presbyterian Church of East Africa. He is one of three elders from Nairobi visiting churches in the Newton Presbytery as part of a partnership exchange between the presbyteries.



In 2006, Rev. Peters spoke at churches in Nairobi when he visited various mission projects there that are supported by our church and other churches in the Newton Presbytery. These projects include a water pipeline that brings water to villages so that people do not have to carry it over long distances and the Kasasule Rural Health Centre in the African bush outside of Kibwezi, Kenya, which provides the only source of medical care for thousands of people. Our church also supports Kenyan students through our annual "Mile of Pennies" drive, since children in Kenya must pay to attend primary and secondary school.

Following a pot-luck luncheon, where attendees had the opportunity to learn more about the Kayole Parish and projects supported by Newton Presbytery, Rev. Peters presented Elder Maina with a commemorative plate from the 125<sup>th</sup> anniversary of our church.

## Gifts of Women and Men Sunday, May 20<sup>th</sup>

During morning worship on May 20<sup>th</sup>, our congregation celebrated Gifts of Women and Men Sunday by recognizing Elaine Giordano and Bill Hopcraft. Following worship, the Worship Committee hosted a special fellowship hour in their honor.


