#### **Pastor's Letter**

Three years ago, my "Pastor's Letter" was about being accountable to other people. It included the following:

The Presbyterian Church (USA) sent out a letter that it had received from The National Evangelical Synod of Syria and Lebanon in which they asked that the "international powers refrain from the use of power against Syria as it would only multiply the suffering and human destruction."

We can see now that the writers of the letter knew what they were talking about. Syria is a mess for all the people, no matter what their religion. We are so entangled that we are having a hard time keeping track of who is fighting who.

Cain asked God the question we all struggle with today, "Am I my brother's keeper?" What is our responsibility to the refugees fleeing the Middle East? What is our responsibility to those who are hungry in our country? What is our responsibility to blacks who are gunned down by police even though they are unarmed? What is our responsibility to the police who are killed for revenge? Do we bear any responsibility for these events or the aftermath of



them? As I'm sure you can guess, I believe we have responsibilities in these matters. More importantly, I believe God demands that we be accountable for at least being aware that these things are happening and why.

During the month of October, we have a number of events to help us understand our responsibility to our fellow human beings. We will begin on October 2<sup>nd</sup> with our celebration of World Communion when we will gather with our brothers and sisters around the world at Christ's table and share in that celebration of love. Our brothers and sisters from the Meyersville Presbyterian Church will be joining us for the service. Following worship, there will be a potluck brunch in Pollard Hall. During the brunch, there will be a program sponsored by the Christian Education Committee entitled, *Feeding Those Who Hunger: How Do WE Respond to the Refugee Crisis?* On the other four Sundays of October, I will be doing a sermon series on the *Belhar Confession*. This confession was accepted into our denominations Book of



Confessions at the General Assembly this past June. It is a confession that came out of the Dutch Reformed Mission Church during apartheid in South Africa. It speaks of oppression, reconciliation, and unity, and I find it very apropos of our times today.

On Sunday, October 16<sup>th</sup>, members of our church will once again participate in the New Providence CROP Walk. This walk supports ministries that feed people who are literally hungry. I hope you will consider joining this 3-mile walk and getting people to sponsor you. If you cannot walk, please consider giving a generous donation to someone who is walking.

Please look at the individual articles in this newsletter about the things I have mentioned. Jesus made it very clear that we are our brother's and sister's keeper when he said, "When you did it to one of the least of these who are members of my family, you did it to me." (Matthew 25:40) If we want peace in our lives, then we have to help others have peace in their lives.

After a few years, the idea spread beyond the Presbyterian Church. We will symbolize this day by using different breads for communion. We hope you will join us for this special service.

#### **Reformation Sunday**

**October 30<sup>th</sup>** is Reformation Sunday. This is the day Presbyterians celebrate the tradition that grounds their faith. It is always the last Sunday in October, marking the occasion in 1517 when Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Martin Luther contributed to major theological reform by translating the Bible into vernacular German, which allowed people to hear and read the gospel of Jesus Christ in their own language. Plan to join us for this important day in our Church's history.

#### All Saints Sunday, November 6<sup>th</sup>

Our worship service on November 6<sup>th</sup> will be held at the Meyersville Presbyterian Church.

We will be observing **All Saints Sunday**, a day when Christians give thanks for all the good people God has placed in their lives. During this service, we will take time to remember those special people we have lost during the past year, and a candle will be lit as each name is read.
