Pastor's Letter



In a sermon entitled, *The Silence of God*, the Rev. Barbara Brown Taylor writes:

The big disillusionment for the chosen people was that God was not where they thought. They thought God was supposed to be with them when they prayed and fasted and studied the scriptures. They thought nothing pleased God more than to find them on their knees, dressed in sackcloth and covered in ashes – but they were wrong.

God was not at their prayer desks with them. God was out in the streets, warming hands over a can of burning garbage with a bunch of drifters, delivering sacks of groceries down at the housing project, handing out blankets to those who slept shivering in the bushes...

As we conclude our Lenten journey and prepare to go through Holy Week, let us be mindful that it is not just about our hosannas, our waving palm branches, or our standing at the foot of the cross. Those help us in our worship of God; however, that is not the fast (worship) God wants from us. God wants us, in the words of Micah, *To do justice, love kindness, and walk humbly with God.* God is found in the fight for the rights of people. God is found in the challenges to an unjust national budget that removes support from people who need it.

Our country is saying God is in the power of our nation, but that is not where God is. God is in relationships where we see the face of a brother or a sister in the faces of our neighbors and in the faces of strangers. Jesus did not tell people they had to pick themselves up by their bootstraps. He held out his hand and lifted them up into life again. If we are indeed a Christian people, we need to be about lifting people up into life again. We need to be about caring for all people, in whatever way they need to be cared for. This Holy week, may we once again claim the mantle of Christ and let go of our human needs for security, wealth, and power, and be more concerned with relationships and sharing. Remember, it was the need for security, wealth, and power that nailed Jesus to the cross in the first place.

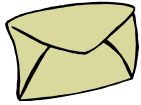
Church Flowers

Iconic Oak Tree to Be Cut Down



The 600-year-old white oak tree located in Basking Ridge has died and will be cut down during the week of April 24th. The landmark tree that has called the Basking Ridge Presbyterian Church home for centuries is located beside the church and has watched over parishioners and the adjacent graveyard for the past 300 years. Heroic efforts to save the tree failed.

Prior to the tree being chopped down, a 25-foot “baby oak” (pictured below), which was grown at Union Country College in their Historic Tree Grove from a seedling from one of the iconic oak’s acorns, will be transplanted to the church property.

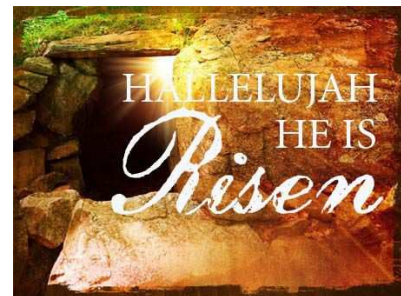
