



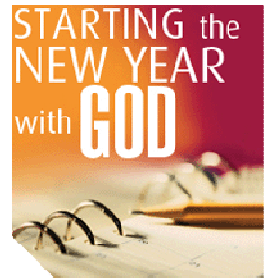

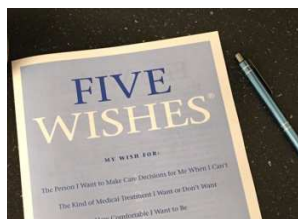
We continue the study of the Book of Revelation at **10:30 a.m. on Thursdays** in the church meeting room.

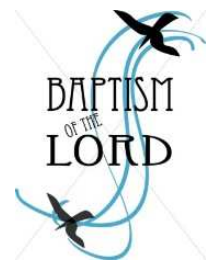
Non-Perishable Food Collection, January 1st - at Meyersville Presbyterian Church
