Pastor's Letter

The other day I saw my daffodil leaves poking up through the snow, along with the leaves of some of my other flowers. The strength and tenacity of plants to make their entrance on time is amazing. This tenacity and power reminded me of the *Season of Easter*.



During the month of April, we are in the *Season of Easter*. Easter is too big for one Sunday. The *Season of Easter* is 8 weeks long; it goes from Easter to Pentecost Sunday (this year on May 20th). However, Easter is so big that every Sunday is a celebration of the resurrection. The reason is that if there had not been some kind of a resurrection then there would have been no church, no Christian religion. That is the power of Easter, the power to create a church and a religion.

The problem is that we sell Easter short. We don't claim the power of Easter for our church or for our own personal lives. Unlike the daffodil leaves, we don't let the resurrection empower us -- lift us up through the trials of life. I've used the following by Rev. Johnny Ray Youngblood in some Easter sermons; it speaks to the power of resurrection in people's lives:

"The reason we're here this morning is not just because a resurrection happened, but because there's one goin' on. Every time I see a brother or sister come to Christ, there's a resurrection goin' on. Every time I see a man put down his bottle, there's a resurrection goin' on. Every time I see someone [a man] go back to school, there's a resurrection goin' on. Every time I see a man hug his son, there's a resurrection goin' on."

["Upon This Rock: The Miracles of a Black Church" by Samuel Freedman]

Easter is too big to cram into one day. The resurrection is too big for 8 weeks or even 52 weeks of Sundays. It is meant to be celebrated, needs to be celebrated and lived, every day of the year. During the month of April, spend some time asking yourself the question "Is my life centered in the resurrection?" Spend some time thinking about how your life would be different if it was centered in the resurrection. We like to think that the eternal life that begins at the resurrection is a future event; but, the gospel writers, especially the writer of John, talk about the resurrection happening, starting in this life. We enjoy the fruits of eternal life now in this life.




Mission of the Month - A Look Ahead to May

Fellowship Hour






Deacons' Fund


