Pastor's Letter



What is love? Today when someone says the word, "love," they generally mean sexual love. They use phrases like, "People make love with one another." It is the act. Christian novelist and writer, Frederick Buechner, writes the following about *love*:

The first stage is to believe that there is only one kind of love. The middle stage is to believe that there are many kinds of love and that the Greeks had a different word for each of them. The last stage is to believe that there is only one kind of love.

The unabashed eros of lovers, the sympathetic philia of friends, agape giving itself away freely no less for the murderer than for the victim (the King James Version translates it as "charity") -- these are all varied manifestations of a single reality. To lose yourself in another's arms, or in another's company, or in suffering for all who suffer, including the ones who inflict suffering upon you -- to lose yourself in such ways is to find yourself. Is what it's all about. Is what love is.

There are a number of different kinds of love in the Greek New Testament and, in one sense, they all mean the same thing; but, in another sense, they all mean something different.

This year, the season of Lent begins on Ash Wednesday, February 14<sup>th</sup>. Lent begins on that great day of the celebration of love, Valentine's Day. At the suggestion of a member of the Worship Committee, I will be doing a Lenten series on *love* entitled, *Which Love Do You Mean*? My purpose in this series is that by understanding the varied meanings of *love*, we can reclaim the nuances of the word "love" and can, therefore, have a fuller understanding of a word that gets used a lot in the Church. Please join me, and let us journey together to learn what ultimately is the *love of God*.

I want to say a big thank you to the members of the church for your generous Christmas gift. I am touched by the many ways you have reached out to share your love with me over the years.

#### **Fellowship Hour**

Fellowship Hour is a very special time of fellowship following each weekly worship service. It is a wonderful time to share stories of the week and catch up with each other over our busy work weeks. Please consider helping with this important part of our church life by signing up to host one yourself or with a partner or simply by donating money to be used to provide some delicious goodies for the morning. If you wish to donate money, please give it to a Deacon or place it in the offering plate in an envelope marked "Fellowship Hour."

What is involved in hosting? The coffee, sugar, plates, napkins, and cups are all available in the kitchen. You can bring milk for coffee/tea (usually about a quart), juice (or simply use water), and some goodies (baked goods, fruit, pretzels, and/or popcorn are some examples) to set out on the table. Coffee and tea are normally served during the fall, winter, and spring. During the summer, we serve cold drinks. If you need help setting up the coffee and tea, please feel free to ask any Deacon or other member of the congregation. Your Fellowship Hour can be as simple or as elaborate as you want. They are fun to do and thoroughly appreciated by all.

## Free Gentle Yoga Class – Meyersville Presbyterian Church


