Shrine of St. Joseph to Host 9/11 Memorial Service

Once again, the Shrine of St. Joseph, on Long Hill Road in Stirling, invites everyone to an ecumenical candlelight vigil service at the Tower of Remembrance at **7:00 p.m. on Tuesday, Sept. 11th**, the seventeenth anniversary of the 9/11 terror attacks. Rev. Peters will be participating in the service.



The Tower of Remembrance is a place where everyone can reflect on the sacredness of lives remembered. The 35-foot Tower Memorial is dedicated to the memory of all those who lost their lives on 9/11. This Tower, emerging from the rubble of violence, reminds us that in God there is hope; that as we remember, we heal.

At the conclusion of the vigil, all are invited to remember and pray as they gong the bell. Attendees are encouraged to bring lawn chairs. In case of rain, the service will be held in the Shrine Chapel.

Annual Argyle Fish & Chips Dinner – September 22nd

Our fifth **Fish & Chips Dinner** is fast approaching. The organizing committee has been meeting since mid-July to get things ready. Now we need to begin asking for help from you, the members and friends of the church. **Please read this entire article:**



- The committee has set a goal of selling 300 tickets. This is ambitious, and it gives us something to strive for. (We have to sell at least 200 in order to get the best discount from Argyle, allowing us to make the most money per meal.) In order to know how we are doing, we need you to sell tickets and also to report to Kai Ihringer by Sunday, September 2nd, how many you have sold to that date. Yes, please do continue selling and reporting after that. The committee needs to keep track of the sales.
- Please save both plastic and paper grocery bags to use for the take-out dinners. If you are a member of Costco or BJ's, we ask you to pick up a few clean cardboard fruit and vegetable flats that they have available for people to use to carry their purchases. These are used for large take-out orders.
- We still have a number of flyers that people can place around Long Hill Twp. and neighboring towns, in your places of business, or to give to friends. If you have not already done so, please take some.
- Because of the September date, we will not have our usual crew of college-age servers, since they will be in school. If you have family or friends who can help us out, please invite them to join our staff for that day, and let us know who they are.
- We are starting a sign-up sheet for people who can help on that day with any number of functions. Please sign-up for yourself, family, and friends so we know who we have available to help. This sheet will be in Pollard Hall. You may also call the church to let us know who is helping, and we will put their names on the sheet.

This is an All-Hands-On-Deck event for our church. Please help in any way you can. **Let's all have fun. This is a fundraiser for the church, but it is also a time to enjoy being together as a church family and as a community.**

The Concert Series in Stirling



Wow, is summer going fast! It's already time to start preparing for September and back to school. Sunday School will start again on **Sunday, Sept. 16th**, following the Children's Talk. There will be 2 classes: one for Pre-K/Kindergarten and a second for older youth.

For Pre-K/Kindergarten, the same story will be used for a month, with different activities for each session. The same format will be used for each class: greeting, prayer, story, activity, snack, closing.

For older youth, we will be using *Seasons of the Spirit* curriculum for 12 to 14 year olds. This curriculum follows the lectionary, so the students will be studying the same Gospel readings as worship.

We are looking for teachers and aides for both classes. Typically, for older youth, there are 2 classes a month. Since Pre-K/Kindergarten is new, we will see how it goes. You can take a month or more. Just let us know what class you are interested in, whether as a teacher or aide, and when.



We will schedule time to go over the curriculum, supplies, etc., and answer any questions you have. Please seriously consider helping the youth of our church learn about God. Just contact one of us from the CE committee if you are interested or just considering and need more information.




Church Flowers





The unlikely friendship between Steve Lopez, a Los Angeles Times columnist, and Nathaniel Ayers, a homeless musician, has inspired newspaper columns, a book, and a movie.


When Lopez met him, Ayers was a homeless musician on Skid Row in Los Angeles. Lopez learned Ayers had been a promising violinist, and that he had left the prestigious music program at the Juilliard School because of his struggle with mental illness.

Lopez chronicled Ayers' struggle in several columns in the Los Angeles Times. These columns inspired readers to send instruments to Ayers through Lopez. The friendship that Lopez formed with Ayers eventually helped the musician get off the street, settle into an apartment, and find treatment for his schizophrenia.

Lopez says his friendship with Ayers has "always been a two-way street, it's not just me doing for him." The writer explains that the musician re-ignited his passion for journalism and gave him a sense of well-being: "You know, there's this humility, there's this good feeling I have from giving something," Lopez says.


This is how the field looked at 7:05 p.m.




