## Pastor's Letter

Toward the end of my sermon on Pentecost Sunday, June 9<sup>th</sup>, I said the following:



*The future of our church will be different; we will have to discern where and what the Spirit is leading us to be and do. You will be hearing about it in the next several months. A group from our church and Meyersville Church has been meeting with people from Presbytery to talk about the ministry of our two churches in Long Hill Township. It is a process that will challenge all of us to get out of the boxes we have been in over the years and begin to think in new ways.*

The committee that has been meeting is called *Future of Long Hill Presbyterians* (FLHiP). During July and August, we will be holding group gatherings to begin telling our stories and listening to each other's stories: stories about worship and mission that have touched us, as well as stories of our hopes and dreams for the future, as individuals and as churches. Please plan to attend one of the gatherings for our church; your input is important and valuable. The stories will be combined with a timeline experience that both churches will do together, as well as the results of a demographics study, and used to begin to discern what God is calling our two churches to do in the future.

The timeline exercise will take place at Meyersville Presbyterian Church on Sunday, Sept. 29<sup>th</sup>. We will worship at Meyersville that morning, instead of the first Sunday in October, and then have a pot-luck lunch and do the timeline exercise. Please make every effort to be at this service.

This is a continuation of the efforts of the Future Church Committee that met for our church during 2017 and reported at a meeting of the congregation. **I must stress that this is not a process to automatically merge the two churches!** We do not know where our two churches will end up, but we know that we must begin a conversation. We will keep you informed about what is happening and when. **We need everyone to participate and be a part of the process.**

I want to say that this is not Presbytery telling us that we must do this. The Session of both churches felt this conversation needed to take place and reached out to Presbytery for help and resources. The time is right because the Session and I have determined that I will retire after the Annual Meeting on the last Sunday in January 2021. By starting this process now, the church can begin to discern what will happen after that.



I believe this can be a time of great promise if we can get everyone involved in the process.

Thank you to Debra Sprague who does the communications and always has ideas for relevant topics for the CE programs. She brings passion to the group.


Thanks to Rev. Peters for being our spiritual leader. He inspires us with his sermons, Bible study, and many CE brunch programs.

The **Mission of the Month for July is Family Promise of Morris County**, a program our church has been supporting for 30 years. Family Promise provides emergency shelter and meals 365 days a year through a network of over 70 houses of worship in Morris County. Families facing homelessness (up to 14 individuals at a time) stay at different congregations of all faiths each week where dedicated volunteers provide a safe and comfortable temporary home for them, including meals, sleeping quarters, and a place where they can relax, socialize, do homework, and watch television.

**Fellowship Hour**



**Coordinating Food Items in the Church Refrigerator**

Have you ever opened the church refrigerator and wondered, "Can I use this drink or food for Fellowship Hour?" Items meant for the Concert Series should be marked with a **YELLOW** sticker. Items placed in the refrigerator with a **GREEN** sticker are available for anyone to use. Thank you for your support in helping with this effort.



*What secrets and betrayals have caused this close-knit family to fracture? Can Amar find his way back to the people who know and love him best?*


