Dear Church Family,

I know it's frustrating. We all want things at the church to get back to "normal." We've learned to adjust to Zoom meetings and have found that to meet, and yet stay at home, works out pretty well most of the time. The hard part is worship. Though being outside also works pretty well, it is just not the same. We want our sanctuary back. We want to sit in a pew in our lovely worship space – hear the sermon from the pulpit and the piano and organ not through a speaker. I know.



The Session and I have read the news, listened to what our presbytery has said, checked the latest from the CDC, and have decided to continue, for the moment, to conduct our in-person worship services outside. The on-line services also continue.

This decision was not made lightly, but the welfare of all of us is the top concern. It is one thing to make individual risk assessments in relation to the choices we make in our own lives – whether to wear a mask at the grocery, whether to gather inside with friends, whether to eat at a restaurant – but it is another thing to make those decisions on behalf of others who may be vulnerable themselves or need to be in close contact with others who are vulnerable, or live with young children who cannot be vaccinated yet. The Session wants to protect "the least of these" among us who may need the protection from an illness that we know can be extremely dangerous and even fatal.

The Session has drawn up and approved protocols for coming inside for worship, which includes wearing masks at all times whether vaccinated or not. As long as there are no new surges in the virus, this will come into effect when the weather no longer allows outdoor worship.

Looking Ahead: November Mission of the Month

In November, our Mission of the Month will be the Market Street Mission in Morristown. Each Thanksgiving for many years, our church has stepped up and members have donated their free turkeys to Market Street Mission to help in their effort to provide a delicious Thanksgiving dinner to many homeless individuals. Throughout the Covid-19 Pandemic, they have continued to provide 200 meals each day to those in immediate need.



They also provide recovery programs and vocational training to those rebuilding their lives, community counseling services, and "regularly scheduled meetings and services that give people a solid foundation for stable lives." In 2020, the **Market Street Mission** provided 86,207 meals to the homeless and poor in Morris County, hosted 21,316 shelter stays, and had 36 graduates of their Life Change recovery program.

This year, we will be supporting the Mission in two ways. We have confirmed that they are accepting food, so <u>we will</u> <u>collect turkeys</u> on the Saturday morning before Thanksgiving. In addition, <u>monetary gifts through Mission of the Month</u> will help them care for an individual's immediate needs today and their long-term needs for a stable and independent tomorrow.

Tom Parziale will be at the church from 10-11 a.m. on Saturday, November 20th, to collect the turkeys (please keep turkeys frozen). He will then deliver them to Morristown.



The special monetary gift will be collected throughout November during worship services. **If you are not able to come to church, feel free to send your donation to the church office or to Elsie Turqman.** Remember to mark it as "<u>November Mission of the Month</u>" and include your name and/or envelope number if you would like your donation to be recorded. Thank you very much in advance for supporting this special mission program.

Update: July/August "Mission of the Month" - Bridges Outreach



During the months of July and August, our **congregation donated \$300 to the Bridges Outreach organization in Summit**. Through the amazing enthusiasm of our church family, we are helping Bridges Outreach continue their mission to "end homelessness through volunteer-driven outreach and individual case management focusing on health, housing, and independence." It is always the last Sunday in October, marking the occasion in 1517 when Martin Luther posted his 95 theses on the church door in Wittenberg, Germany. Martin Luther contributed to major theological reform by translating the Bible into vernacular German, which allowed people to hear and read the gospel of Jesus Christ in their own language.

"Much Ado About Nothing" is a comic play about two pairs of Italian lovers. It focuses on the character of Claudio, who has recently returned from war and pledged to marry Hero. However, the scheming Don John decides to interfere and successfully convinces Claudio that Hero has been unfaithful to him, leading to a series of misunderstandings and comic antics before the truth finally comes to light.

However, this storyline is often upstaged by the play's subplot, in which two of Shakespeare's wittiest and most beloved characters, Benedick and Beatrice, gradually fall in love with each other in spite of their avowed mutual scorn for love, marriage and – most importantly – each other!

"Much Ado About Nothing" is one of the best-known comedies by William Shakespeare, who is widely considered to be one of the most influential writers in the history of the English language.
