Dear Church Family,

We have just come through the hustle and bustle of one of the busiest seasons of our year. The church has been telling the story of the birth of Jesus, and our families have been busy with preparations and celebrations. We all get caught up in expectations of perfect pageantry, performances, and presents. We have no training in acting and not much musical ability, yet we want to attend and participate in the concerts, pageants, and shows of the season. I think we just want to be part of a great story. Church attendance and commitment over the Christmas season indicates that our congregation wants to be part of it, too. We want the story of God coming into the world to mean something to us, to touch us, to change our lives.

Though the story of Christmas is almost over for this year, the story of God coming into the world is not, by any means, over. The story continues in Scripture through the New Testament; it continues through the church year with Epiphany and Lent and Easter and Pentecost; and it continues by the Holy Spirit's work in the world through history and today. The continuing story of God's activity in the world may not be as sentimentally appealing as the Christmas story; it may not require costumes, but the church is not finished telling about the love of God and not finished showing the presence of God, and God is certainly not finished with this world of ours.



Per-Capita Apportionment

Our 2023 per-capita apportionment to the Presbytery, Synod, and General Assembly is **\$43.50 per active member**. This represents our share of the administrative costs of the Presbytery and the General Assembly of the Presbyterian Church USA. The Session is asking the congregation to consider paying the per capita for your family. In this way, you enable our church to use all pladge manager for our church's operating expanses, church programs, and mission commitment



pledge money for our church's operating expenses, church programs, and mission commitments. If you are a member and do not contribute to the church financially, the *per capita* charge for you and your household comes out of our annual budget. 


Flowers to Beautify Our Sanctuary

Mission Programs

Bridges Outreach Lunch Program

We continue to provide lunch bags to the Bridges Outreach organization for distribution to the homeless in Newark, Irvington, and NYC. Currently, one person is making sandwiches and one person is filling the brown bags. The children from the Montessori School often decorate the bags and write messages to the recipients. The sandwiches, drinks, and non-perishable goodies are delivered to Summit monthly.



We are always in need of small bottles of water or cartons of juice; snacks of cookies, nuts, Goldfish, pretzels; and small fruit cups, applesauce, pudding, etc. Cash donations are also appreciated to help with the purchase of bread and lunch meat. You can <u>drop items off in Pollard Hall (call the office to confirm that someone is there) or send monetary donations to Elsie Turgman</u>.

Twelve Baskets Food Pantry

Our local Food Pantry, Twelve Baskets, is housed at All Saints' in Millington. Jointly sponsored by our church, All Saints', Meyersville, and LHT CERT, the food pantry has been serving guests on the first and third Saturday mornings of each month. Shelf stable food as well as meat, dairy products, eggs, and fresh produce are available for food insecure families in our area.

Volunteer help is needed to set up tables, put the food out, and then pack it up afterwards. Help is also needed for picking up food from the distribution center in Hillside. There is plenty to do, and the volunteer opportunities are well organized. Please contact Lynn Blakeslee or Barbara Aspinall if you would like to contribute an hour or two of your time. <u>Food items</u>: baby food, applesauce, shelf-stable milk, cold cereal, crackers, chips, coffee, dried herbs and spices, canola oil, olive oil

<u>Non-food items</u>: diapers, baby wipes, paper towels, toilet paper, household cleaners, soap, toothbrushes, toothpaste, shampoo, conditioner


Church Archives - Jan Somers

Meyersville Book Club

Our February selection is "The Prize Winner of Defiance, Ohio" by Terry Ryan. The group will meet via Zoom on Wednesday, February 8th, 7:30 p.m. to discuss the book. Everyone is welcome to join the group; please contact Rev. Aspinall so she can send you the Zoom link. The book is available at local libraries in different formats.



The Prize Winner of Defiance, Ohio is based on the true story of housewife Evelyn Ryan, who helped support her husband, Kelly, and their 10 children by winning jingle-writing contests. Kelly failed to support his family, in part due to apparent alcoholism and low self-esteem. He dreamed of being a singer, but lost his singing voice in a car accident, and was often cruel and abusive.

Evelyn wins a large freezer, ice buckets, a washer, and dryer set, a trip to New York City, sleds, boots, a pony, a palm tree, a window, a sports car, a shopping spree in her local grocery store, ice crushers, a camera, dance shoes, a boat motor, pogo sticks, a case of dog food, and a lifetime supply of bird seed. Kelly, who feels like his role as provider for the family is being threatened, criticizes Evelyn, and damages the prizes she wins. Their children side with her. Kelly gets angry at Evelyn, and accidentally knocks her over while she is carrying 12 full glass bottles of milk, causing her to nearly sever a ligament. Evelyn is able to talk him down after

each incident, and, temporarily at least, he treats her better. As time passes, the older children start moving out for college and participating in sport career, lessening some burdens to the family.

Evelyn is largely isolated because of the hours she has to spend caring for the children and the lack of local intellectual equals. However, she is contacted by a group of other contest-entering mid-western housewives and befriends them. Ultimately, Evelyn discovers that Kelly had secretly taken out a second mortgage on their house and never made payments on it, leaving the family subject to certain foreclosure. The children pray for their mother's miraculous victory in a contest sponsored by Dr Pepper. She wins and pays the mortgage on the house.
