
MISSION

MISSION OF THE MONTH

Our Joint-Church Mission Committee has chosen **Village 2 Village as the Mission of the Month for June.** Village 2Village supports vulnerable children through education, medical care, nutrition, and social and spiritual mentoring. It builds relationships with children and families one at a time, seeing them as individuals with untapped potential to change their communities.

Village2Village began in 2003 with only \$100 to help nine school-aged children in Uganda who lived with elderly and sick grandparents or no adults at all. This \$100 bought one bag of rice and beans, nine school uniforms, and nine backpacks. It has grown to serve 200+, many with special needs including HIV/AIDS. With God's help and support from congregations like ours, it has become a staffed organization, recognized by Uganda as non-governmental organization (NGO) since 2006.

After many years of fiscal sponsorship by First Baptist Church of Bristol, Vermont, Village2Village Project became a separate 501c3 charitable organization at the end of 2016. They now have partners in 40 countries, reaching out from their "villages" into rural Africa to serve some of the world's most desperate children. Village2Village Project has growing University and vocational programs, and their first students are graduating and beginning to give back to their community. Their goal is always to meet the individual needs of each child so they can reach their potential and change their world. They continue to grow because the need is so desperate.

TWELVE BASKETS - Moving to FPC-Stirling in June

Our local Food Pantry, Twelve Baskets, is co-sponsored by All Saint's Church, First Presbyterian Church in Stirling, Meyersville Presbyterian Church and Long Hill Township CERT and Community Services.

The pantry is currently housed at All Saints' Church in Millington, will be moving to FPC-Stirling for the months of July, August, and September again this year. Shelf stable food as well as meat, dairy products, eggs, and fresh produce are available for food insecure families in our area.



Some of the food will be stored at FPC-Stirling, and guests will come there on the scheduled the 1st and 3rd Thursdays from 5:30-6:00pm. **Volunteer help is needed** to set up Pollard Hall as well as serve guests on the days the pantry is open. Help is also needed in picking up food from the distribution center in Hillside. AUDIT -FIRST PRESBYTERIAN CHURCH OF STIRLING

An audit committee consisting of Sandy Mackay, Ed Gerecht and Janet Parziale conducted an audit of the General Operations and Dedicated Fund accounts for the 2023 calendar year of the First Presbyterian Church of Stirling. The audit occurred on April 17, 2024. Kai Ihringer, Treasurer and Linda Murphy, Office Manager assisted with the audit. The Presbytery Financial Review Checklist was used as a guide examining Income, Disbursements, Reports, General Ledger, Administrative and Payroll.

The Audit Committee informed the Clerk of Sessions and the Pastor that the committee did not find any discrepancies in the audit. A separate review of the Endowment Fund was conducted, which reviewed opening and closing balances, as well as confirming that no disbursements occurred during 2023.
