PASTOR'S NOTE

What if someone told you they believed in unicorns because the Bible says they existed? In the King James version of the Bible there are seven references to unicorns. In Psalm 22, the Psalmist asks God for protection "from the horns of the unicorns".

The mystery of the unicorn in Bible begins over 200 years before the birth of Jesus—in a Bible known as the Septuagint. Scholars were translating the Hebrew scriptures into Greek. They came across an unfamiliar Hebrew word for a large, powerful, wild animal. They chose the Greek word for this wild animal which means 'one horned'. As history progressed, the Septuagint was used to translate the Bible into a Latin Bible (the Vulgate). In the Latin this creature translated 'unicornus". In 1604, King James I of England commissioned a new Bible translation for the Church of England. The translators studied various Bibles as sources for their English rendition, including the Septuagint and the Vulgate. In their final translation, the name of the mystery animal was translated as 'unicorn.'

The animal referenced in 7 places in the Hebrew scriptures was a wild mountain ox. When this animal was drawn from the side it looked like a one horned bull. Calling it a unicorn was just a mistranslation. Modern versions have corrected this. Psalm 22 in our pew Bibles (NRSV) reads that God has rescued the writer "from the horns of the wild oxen".

I acknowledge that reading the Bible is complicated. The 39 books we Protestants call the Old Testament were written in ancient Hebrew (and Aramaic). And the 27 books in the New Testament were written in a Greek not even spoken today in Greece. All of those 66 books were composed over 1500 years. We encounter poetry, narrative history, wisdom literature, epistles and much more in the Bible. All this makes reading and understanding this "book" difficult. It makes mistranslations of a one-horned animal being referred to as a unicorn happen. But reading the Bible is a must.

God has given **us** the scriptures. It is the inspired Word of God. Through the work of the Holy Spirit, the Bible is a window into understanding God's constant connection with us, from the beginning of time to today. By studying the scriptures, we start to understand God's steadfast loyalty, endless love, and boundless goodness. The Bible has been and is still misunderstood and even misused. Our forbearers fought in the reformation so that the Bible was accessible to everyone. Even if it is a complex work, it is not up to any small or vocal group to tell the 'average' Christian what it says. It is God's Word given to all God's people. So every one who cares about the messages taken from scripture, should strive to read the book for themselves.

We can do hard but important things together. Every other week 5 to 7 folks gather after church to study the Bible. I bring knowledge and tools. And together we all bring all our experiences, thoughts and questions. What we discover is not archaic or irrelevant. You (sadly) won't find any unicorns. But something sacred happens when we engage these God-inspired words. The Spirit guides us. We laugh. We find guidance for our lives. God speaks. We often discover more questions. But truth is revealed and faith is grown when we turn to God's Word in scripture. Join us Sunday June 30th and July 28th to study God's Holy Book.


AUGUST: Bridges Outreach

Bridges Outreach seeks to make an impact on the lives of homeless folks living in Newark, Irvington, Summit, and NYC. Their mission is "Bridges ends homelessness through volunteer-driven outreach and individual case management focusing on health, housing and independence. We form relationships with those experiencing homelessness while meeting their most urgent needs." They have provided lunches, socks and underwear, toiletries, soup, and clothing to over 21,000 homeless folks. In addition, they also provide case management services at their Project Connect office in Newark, see folks in Summit every Friday for their Neighbors in Need program, and for more than 1,000 children eligible for free and reduced lunch in Summit and sheltered children in Newark and Irvington, they provide new backpacks and school supplies. 
